

At Special Equestrians, we harness the healing power of horses to transform lives. Here, differences are embraced and individuality is celebrated.

Our programs are driven by the awareness that every person learns differently - and careful evaluation determines which activities, horse and instructional style are most likely to bring new competencies to a rider.

We operate year-round and our property features an indoor and outdoor arena, a therapy room, a 24-station Sensory Trail, and an observation lounge and classroom. We also offer off-site visits, and take our horses to schools and senior centers.



Our staff consists of full-time and parttime people, and they work tirelessly to ensure our barn, horses, and programs are run smoothly and efficiently. Their passion for SE's success is unwavering.



From miniature to draft, our horses come in every shape, size, and color. Our herd is specially trained to ensure our riders get the most out of their lessons, and we are so fortunate to have them as part of our programs.



On average, we see over 200 riders in a given year, and each one of them is just as special as the next.



WHO WE SERVE

Our riders and students come to us from all walks of life, and we are committed to serving anyone who can benefit from our services.

We offer therapeutic riding lessons for individuals who meet criteria for numerous diagnoses, including autism spectrum disorder, intellectual and development disabilities, ADHD, cerebral palsy, genetic disorders, brain injuries, in addition to cognitive and sensory dysfunction.

Through our group programs, we work with at-risk youth, students with autism and learning disabilities, women in recovery, children in residential foster care, senior living centers and cancer support groups.


3,148 Turnout Hours in the 6 Winter Months



2,222 Turnout Hours in the 6 Summer Months








Key Diagnosis for Group Lessons


- Our very own Z was recognized as the The Pennsylvania National Horse Show Foundation 2021 Therapy Horse Of The Year
- We celebrated this honor with the County Commissioners and took Glow along to make new friends








